Chairman's Report



2020 will be a year that none of us will forget.

Covid-19 has changed everything we do. No more face to face meetings, a new way of working for Councillors' meetings by Zoom and staff working from home and learning new skills.

I would like to put on record my sincere thanks to all staff and Councillors for all they are

doing and continue to do in these extremely difficult times.

Despite the challenges of the Covid-19 pandemic, the Council has continued to work hard on behalf of our community. During the year, we have continued to award grants and Service Level Agreements to local organisations and we have set up a hardship grant fund which is open to organisations, clubs and charities.

Our committees and working parties have continued to meet and to help steer decisions which affect the town. For example, the Town Council has agreed to contribute £158k in match funding to Devon County Council as part of its recent bid to the Pinch Point Fund to secure funding to complete the Dinan Way extension.

Our Flooding and Land Drainage Working Party is also busy in discussions with the relevant authorities to come up with a co-ordinated plan for closing the new flood gates which are due to be installed as part of the Environment Agency's flood defence works in Exmouth.

One of the casualties of Covid-19 was, regrettably, the cancellation of the extremely popular Exmouth Festival for the first time in 22 years. At the time of writing, the prospect of the Town Council hosting any Christmas events, including its annual lantern parade, also seems difficult but we will do what we can to bring festive cheer to the town.

Exmouth Town Council is normally made up of 25 Councillors, however at present we have two vacancies: one each in Littleham and Town Wards. These will hopefully be filled via elections in May 2021, subject to Covid-19 regulations. All Councillors are here to serve you and your Ward Councillor details can be found on the Council's website so please do contact them if you have any queries or questions.

Exmouth Town Council also has a good working relationship with our higher tiers of councils: East Devon District Council and Devon County Council.

Planning Committee

Exmouth Town Council's Planning Committee meets approximately every two weeks to consider applications in its capacity as a statutory consultee. The Committee also has delegated authority to determine tree and advertisement applications. In 2019, the Planning Committee met on 26 occasions and considered 371 applications.

Finance Committee

Our Finance Committee meets once a quarter and has delegated responsibility for managing the Council's budget. Exmouth Town Council is empowered to award grants under a specific section of the Local Government Act 1972, known simply as Section 137. Gorfin Hall Solar Panels

Exmouth Town Council is pleased to announce that Gorfin Hall, its well-used community hall in Claremont Lane, is now being powered by solar electricity, thanks to a new roof-mounted solar system.

The project follows the declaration of a Climate Emergency by Exmouth Town Council in June 2019 and the subsequent formation of a Climate Change Task and Finish Forum. This Forum has recommended a strategy and action plan for the Town Council with the aim of reducing the Council's overall carbon footprint and establishing it as a community leader in tackling the climate change crisis.

Council took the decision to add to There's a lot going on in this pot to deliver this very successful event again.


