#### F22/04. Report from the Responsible Financial Officer

The RFO report highlighted that there were no areas of concern in terms of budgetary control and that any cost codes that have exceeded the agreed budget for 2021/22 had been previously reported to Committee with the expectation that the overspend will be taken from reserves / adjusted at the end of the financial year.

It was noted that the Trust Fund Working Party was due to meet imminently to discuss recommendations from Thomas Westcott Chartered Financial Planners to sell the US denominated shares and reinvest the equivalent monies into an investment fund which would be easier to manage.

LB confirmed that the expression of interest prepared by the Tourism Officer in respect of the Innovation and Resilience Fund administered by East Devon District Council had been accepted and a full application was being submitted with the hope of securing some funding towards the development of the site and to cover costs of an enhanced social media campaign for Visit Exmouth for 2022.
