## Tree copse and Mosaic bench in Phear Park to remember the Coronation of King Charles III

Young people in Exmouth have been involved in planting 10 special trees and designing and making a mosaic bench in Phear Park as a legacy for the Coronation of King Charles III.

This project, initiated by Exmouth Town Council, was to encourage young people to get involved and a sense of ownership in seeing something they have made and designed as a lasting legacy.

The project consisted of two parts, tree planting and designing and making of mosaic panels for a bench.



Ten trees, one for each school in Exmouth, were planted in April in a semi-circle shape to form a copse. The children that attended heard why it is important to have trees, the benefits they bring to the environment and wildlife and were taught how best to plant a tree.

Mosaic panels were designed and made by young people at the Hive's youth group sessions with the help of artists Allan Punton and Manya McMahon. The designs were created by the young people from Space Youth Services, led by the artists who also taught them how to use mosaics and to transform the designs into mosaic art.

Councillor Olly Davey, Mayor of Exmouth, said: "We're very excited to have helped the young people plant these trees and make the beautiful mosaic panels which will be a reminder for many years to come. We are grateful to EDDC for allowing us to create this wonderful legacy in Phear Park."
